I also would like to acknowledge the passing of my longtime friend and Mentor Rabbi Michael Lerner on August 28, 2024. As the Editor of Tikkun Magazine, his ideas about the "Politics of Meaning" influenced millions of people, including Bill Clinton. Absorbing and expressing some of those ideas actually helped Clinton to get elected in 1992. I became one of Rabbi Michael Lerner's main conference organizers in the 1990s, and that experience contributed to my creating <u>We, The World</u> in 1998! 20 years after our historic launch of <u>11 Days of Global Unity</u> on September 21st in 2004, Dr. Jane Goodall and Dr. Riane Eisler sat down for <u>extended interviews</u> with me to mark this Milestone Anniversary. Democracy - If We Can Keep It

Inspired by a 1787 quote by Benjamin Franklin, this represents a call to all of us - in the United States and elsewhere - to come together to address the ongoing challenges to our Rights, Liberties and Freedoms. What's at stake in the USA? The Rights of Women, LGBTQ+ people, Teachers, Educators, Immigrants; our Voting Rights; our collective Economic Wellbeing; as well as our Individual and Societal Health.

Regarding the Crisis of our Democracy, I encourage you to check out our recent <u>11 Days of Global Unity</u> <u>Summit Panel on FREEDOM</u> featuring Michael Wayne and Dr. Marty K. Casey. In general, I believe we are facing a major threat to Democracy resulting from Big Money Special Interests in our Politics and the resulting Minority Rule, fueled by Extreme Political Polarization and Intolerance. Over decades, this has led to a widespread distrust in 2 of our major institutions of Democracy: Government and the Media (Press). There is a mixed record of trust in the other institutions of Health, Science & Technology, Corporations & Wall Street, and Religious Institutions. What's left? Academics & Education, and Civil Society. While Civil Society is very diverse and often lacks adequate financial backing, it still offers the possibility of creating Pro-Democracy movements large enough to effectively address this threat.

Much of the current distrust in our major institutions of Democracy results from an upsurge in the spread of Misinformation and Disinformation by "Click Bait Disinformation Media Profiteers" who have created a "Hurricane of Lies" that have characterized the rhetoric of politicians who use Conspiracy Theories and Hate Speech endlessly repeated, and echoed by their Big Money supported Media Platforms, as they attempt to hold onto power. Recently that phrase surfaced when FEMA workers were threatened and prevented from doing their jobs to protect victims of Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton in Florida because of Lies and Conspiracy Theories gaining traction on Social Media.

Unfortunately, this adds to a long list of real-world consequences of Lies, Conspiracy Theories and Hate Speech including: multiple Mass Shootings where the killers invoked a version of "The Great Replacement Theory" - or when high profile politicians claim that immigrants are criminals, rapists and pet eaters, or large numbers of Non-Citizens vote in US Elections, or that Poll Workers mishandle Ballots to benefit a particular Candidate or Party. Such claims undermine the safety and security of communities around the country, while weakening confidence in the US Electoral system. And more broadly, this "Us Vs Them" mindset of Intolerance is keeping people from coming together to solve the problems that we are ALL facing.

WELCOME AND COMMENTARY

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Many of us who are concerned about the Media are recommending that Instead of the Mainstream Media focusing on (and repeating) the Lies and Conspiracy Theories of politicians, they could be doing stories on WHY these politicians are repeating them so much. For example, the widespread false claim that "Election fraud is rampant" is used by many politicians to back legislation making it harder to vote, and has led to more poor and minority groups being purged from Voter Rolls and disenfranchised.

To address some of these threats to Democracy, <u>We, The World</u> has developed (and is seeking funding for) several powerful programs: The Media & Communication Literacy Campaign, The WE Party Non-Partisan Program, The Truth and Reconciliation Hearings and most especially WE Power America (at https://WE.net/wpa) to expand WE Power - the power of people to come together to transform our society for the Common Good. Let's work together so our Democracy actually embodies "WE Consciousness". Then we can go from a ME Society to a WE Society!




RECOMMENDED READING

In the news we are reading about and hearing the terms autocrat and autocracy in discussions about the Republican candidate as well as leaders around the world such as Putin of Russia, Orban of Hungary and Erodgan of Turkey. An autocrat is someone who has complete and absolute power over the country they rule. An autocrat completely dominates the institutions of governments, eliminates any opposition and demands obedience from all of the people in the country they control. For the first time in its over two hundred years of existence there is the possibility that the United States may be ruled by an autocrat. To understand what an autocrat and autocracy is, and the impact of autocratic rule, we are recommending the following three books.




Autocracy, Inc.: The Dictators Who Want to Rule The World by Anne Applebaum, Doubleday, 2024

Anne Applebaum, the author of Twilight of Democracy (2020), goes beyond the impact of autocracy in a single country and explores how the development of modern networks of authoritarianism that threaten global democracy throughout the world. She also shows how traditional methods of containing autocrats and autocratic systems, like economic sanctions or international condemnation, fail to effectively weaken autocratic regimes. Applebaum calls for democracies to fundamentally rethink their strategies to counter this new form of autocratic collaboration.



Strongmen: Mussolini to the Present by Ruth Ben-Ghiat, W.W. Norton, 2020

Ruth Ben-Ghiat, a professor of history and Italian Studies at New York University, provides a detailed discussion of how demagogues rise to power by proclaiming themselves as the saviors of their nations. Starting with Mussolini, who ruled Italy from the 1920s to the 1940s, and taking us forward to modern times, the author provides us with the information on not only how autocrats come to power but also how we can recognize them and resist their coming to power.



<u>On Freedom by Timothy Snyder, Penguin Random House,</u> 2024

Written by the Yale historian and expert on Eastern Europe, Snyder is also the author of On Tyranny (2017), his latest book is a meditation on freedom. It discusses the concept itself and explores those who are struggling for freedom against autocratic regimes. As we continue to struggle for freedom in whatever country we live, this book provides us with guidance to think about what it means for each of us and what we can do the preserve it against the rise of autocracy.

11 DAYS: A ROADMAP TO PEACE

It was a moment of horror and a moment of unity. The attacks of September 11, 2001 were a chance to change the world, when the hearts of humanity were aligned in care across all borders. Yet that moment passed. The heart connection was broken by a search for blame and a war that followed.

The lives lost on September 11th are commemorated each year at the site of the towers that fell in New York City. This is a moving ceremony but does not reflect the precious moment of global solidarity that followed the tragic event.

Yet one man refused to let this opportunity slip from our grasp: Rick Ulfik, founder of We, The World. Rick had been involved in the NGO community at the United Nations, including the Gandhi-King Season for Nonviolence. He had founded We, The World in 1998 and we all wondered what this one fellow, filled with enthusiasm but short on resources, could do with such an ambitiously-named organization. Little did we know! Within a few short years, he had garnered endorsements from such international luminaries as Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Dr. Jane Goodall, Dr. Deepak Chopra, Riane Eisler, Bill McKibben, and many others.

But Rick's vision of We didn't stop there. Rick and I knew one another from the close community of NGOs (non-governmental organizations) affiliated with the United Nations working toward nonviolence and peace. Since I was representing the prayer "May Peace Prevail on Earth," a main focus for me was the International Day of Peace. This day was designated on the opening day of the General Assembly annually, but it had recently been moved to the fixed date of September 21st each year. The last year of the floating date was - yes, unbelievably - September 11, 2001. The Secretary-General and dignitaries had gathered to ring the Peace Bell in the garden of the United Nations headquarters when everyone heard the planes flying low over the East River toward the Twin Towers.

Rick was always on board for peace.

In 2004, Rick joined with Troy Lush to launch 11 Days of Global Unity from September 11 to September 21, symbolically marking the transformative journey from fear to hope. What's more, the two envisioned that each of the 11 Days would have a theme, moving from the precious spirit of Unity the world felt on September 11th to the vision of a world at peace on September 21st.

The eleven themes are more than simply goals for a thriving future: they can be seen as a roadmap leading to a world at peace. Unity takes us to Interdependence, a passion of Rick, who has long been advocating for an Interdependence Day. This is actually the truth of who we are as a people, as a global family, as interwoven components of the vast web of life. Interdependence insists that we take care of the Environment that sustains all life. Yet the riches of the world, both natural and manmade, are not shared equally among our human community, so Economic Justice is necessary to bring harmony. If we can achieve better balance, we can support Health and Wellness, so vital for life to thrive. We need to support the Children & Youth to grow into healthy, happy adults who can steward a thriving world. This cannot be achieved without equal opportunities for Women, who still have no voice in many parts of the world. With this empowerment, all countries can proudly stand for Human Rights for all. Only then can the universal dream of Freedom come true. Yet that freedom and all that humanity has built still trembles under the overwhelming threat that can only be stemmed by nuclear Disarmament. These are the stepping stones that lead us along the path to Peace, our shared focus on September 21st. Only a world at peace can address together the challenges of the future posed by climate change, as well as threats from artificial intelligence, unstable leaders or new viruses. Perhaps there are even advanced civilizations just waiting for humans to stop killing one another before allowing us to join a vast network of star nations?

This year, we celebrate the 20th anniversary of the 11 Days of Global Unity, renewing our commitment to build a culture of peace, justice, sustainability and transformation. And we celebrate the audacity of one man, Rick Ulfik, to challenge us to stand together as We, The World.



WE HAVE THE BODIES.

Every year we celebrate our birthdays together. My friend, Bernie and I. We break out the cribbage board, make tea and talk.

Today she told me she went to three residential schools. Three. I knew she went to one. We talked about it over the years. Not much. Just in safe moments and always in whispered tones. Today was different. Today she told more. Two of the schools had those electric chairs. She saw them. She saw a boy once die in that chair. She stopped speaking the language that day.

All the schools were bad she said. All of them did terrible things to the children. She said they did tell their parents and others at home about what was happening. No one believed them. She said," even our parents did not believe us. They thought we just did not want to go back to school. They thought we were making it up." We both agreed it would be hard to believe something so evil as hurting children.

Evil. That is the word we both thought was the only one appropriate. Evil done in the name of their God. It was the collusion between church and the federal government across both colonized nations on this northern continent. If we are to see justice, it must cross borders, just as the bodies do. Neither Canada nor the United States can claim to be absolved of this sin, of this crime against humanity. They continue to not be held accountable for the crimes.

Today she told me she lost four more family members in the last month. One, got disconnected from life support yesterday after a drug overdose that rendered her brain dead. Two have gone missing from separate locations connected with the oil industry. Diabetes finally took her brother. She said," It is like they moved the school outside the building, and we are still there. In that bad place."


It is true. We have the bodies to prove it. Not just the bodies of those children buried on the school grounds. The bodies of the brother that died from a drug overdose and the son that died by suicide. The bodies of the sister that is behind bars and that daughter sleeping on the streets.

As the count of those found under the ground grows and we have our birthday tea, we wondered if we will ever count those "off campus" bodies. We wonder how we are not yet among them as we celebrate our 67th birthdays together over a cup of tea and a conversation.

HOW TO BUILD A SOLIDARITY ECONOMY: THE LOGIC OF NON-REFORMIST REFORMS

As co-coordinators of the <u>US Solidarity Economy</u> <u>Network</u> (USSEN), we routinely face the joys and challenges of working with a wide range of social change agents and organizations to advance an explicitly post-capitalist framework.

We've been at this for a while. USSEN was formed in 2007 at the first <u>US Social Forum</u> in Atlanta when approximately 15,000 folks gathered under the banner "Another World is Possible and Another US is Necessary." The goals, then as now, were to organize around a common vision—one that centers racial, economic, and ecological justice; strengthens ties among existing organizations; and builds a broader and better-connected social justice movement.

But it is one thing to say that you are building a <u>solidarity economy</u> within a dominant <u>capitalist</u> <u>economy</u> and quite another to actually do it. A key strategy that we have found helpful in enacting our vision is the concept of "non-reformist reforms."

Understanding the Nature of Capitalism

Since USSEN is explicitly post-capitalist, we believe it is worth describing what capitalism is in plain and straightforward language. Simply put, it is a system in which a few owners of capital (capitalists) make money from earning profits from the work done by the vast majority of people, who must work for a wage to earn a living.

Some people believe economics is too hard for people without formal education to understand, but we disagree. It is important to note that the word economy comes from the Greek word oikonomia, which simply means "management of the home." The owning class intentionally obscures how they undemocratically and unjustly make decisions about how the economy operates. That is why we recognize the importance of understanding—and teaching—the basics of economics.

There are resources out there that can help. Our friends at <u>Movement Generation</u> wrote a seminal zine, <u>From Banks and Tanks to Cooperation and Caring: A</u> <u>Strategic Framework for a Just Transition.</u> As Movement Generation observes:

The primary purpose of the dominant economy what we call the Extractive Economy—is the accumulation, concentration and enclosure of wealth and power. If the purpose of a Regenerative Economy is ecological restoration, community resilience, and social equity, then resources must be acquired through regeneration.

Like cancer, capitalism will kill its host if we do not move beyond it.

The <u>Center for Popular Economics</u>, a collective of economists once directed by coauthor Kawano, works with activists and educators to demystify how the economy works and build an economy that puts people before profit. For over 40 years, they have offered a detailed definition of capitalism which points to five primary defining (and interrelated) characteristics:

• Private Ownership of the Means of Production (the MOPs)

In capitalism, the materials, facilities, machinery, and tools used to produce goods and services are owned by private individuals or capitalists.

Wage Labor

In capitalism, workers provide labor in exchange for a wage which is treated as just another commodity to be used to produce goods and services—and is bought and sold via the market.

Profit Maximization

There is a competitive dynamic in a capitalist system that drives profit maximization supported by the false notion that this will lead to optimal outcomes. Note that class conflict is built into the system, as capitalists seek to maximize profits, generally on the backs of workers.

Commodity Production

In capitalism, goods and services are produced for sale, rather than being based on need.

Market Allocation

In capitalism, the decisions about what goods/services are produced, how they are distributed, what they cost, and how finance and investment decisions are made are determined by "supply and demand" with little regard for social impact.

Taken together, these characteristics explain why capitalism creates class conflict, inequality, market failure, destroys the environment, cultivates excess materialism, and creates boom-and-bust economic cycles.

More dangerously, capitalism functions like a cancer cell because it is premised on unlimited growth on a finite planet. In other words, we are consuming Mother Earth's resources faster than she can replenish herself. Like cancer, capitalism will kill its host if we do not move beyond it.

The Principles of a Solidarity Economy

Of course, capitalism is often defended as being necessary to our existence. Margaret Thatcher, the former British prime minister, famously <u>claimed</u> that "there is no alternative." We disagree. In particular, the solidarity economy offers a very promising framework for an economy centered on people rather than profits. This framework consists of five profoundly different core principles to describe how an economy can meet people's needs.

• Solidarity

This includes a broad range of social interactions grounded in the collective practices of cooperation, mutualism, sharing, reciprocity, altruism, love, compassion, caring, and gifting.

• Equity

This framework opposes all forms of oppression and discrimination, whether it is based on ethnicity, gender, religion, sexual orientation, or anything else.

• Sustainability

This framework understands that all life is interconnected and interdependent. We embrace the concept of *buen vivir* (right living or living well).

• Participatory Democracy

The solidarity economy framework is premised on the notion that democracy should extend beyond elections to the workplace, policymaking, institutions, governance structures. Decision-making should be as local as possible in order to empower communities. If a decision affects you, then you should be allowed to participate in making that decision.

Pluralism

The solidarity economy framework is not a dogmatic and fixed blueprint. It acknowledges that there are multiple paths to the same goal: creating a world that centers the welfare of people and planet. In short, a positive vision has been developed. The question is how to get there—and the question of getting from here to there, we assert, is ultimately a question of strategy, or what we call a strategic orientation.

A Strategic Orientation Is Not a Fixed Strategic Plan A strategic orientation and a strategic plan are related but different concepts.

A strategic orientation refers to the overarching worldview or philosophy that guides actions and decisions toward achieving long-term objectives. It encompasses the fundamental beliefs, values, and goals that drive movement or organizational behavior and shapes its approach to addressing challenges and opportunities in the external environment. Essentially, it defines identity and purpose, setting the direction for all strategic endeavors.

A non-reformist reform is designed to [help people] in the context of a strategic orientation that's designed to ultimately transform the entire system.

On the other hand, a strategic plan is a formalized roadmap that outlines specific actions, initiatives, and objectives designed to realize a strategic orientation. It translates the broader strategic vision into actionable steps, detailing timelines, resources, and responsibilities to ensure alignment and coherence in execution. A strategic plan typically includes elements such as goal setting,

implementation, performance metrics, resource allocation, and risk management strategies. It serves as a blueprint for guiding decision-making and resource allocation across different levels and functions within the organization.

Having a strategic plan can help with the nuts and bolts. Nonprofits are often good at these. But to transition from capitalism to solidarity requires a clear strategic orientation—an orientation that we call nonreformist reforms.

Non-Reformist Reforms: Solidarity Economy Politics in the Real World

André Gorz, a leading theorist of what was then regularly called the "<u>New Left</u>," first coined the term <u>"non-reformist reforms</u>" in the 1960s to describe reforms that immediately improve people's lives *and also build power* to achieve more systemic change. To be clear, we genuinely and sincerely honor efforts to heal whatever hurts that people have. But a nonreformist reform is designed to do that in the context of a *strategic orientation* that's designed to ultimately transform the entire system.

Consider the Black Panthers' <u>free breakfast</u> <u>program</u>. In one sense it was a reform that fed hungry children, obviously a beautiful thing. What made it a *non-reformist* reform was that it was part of a deeper, more radical vision. A community garden might be merely a place to get nutritious, local organic food. But if it is part of an effort to wean a community off dependence on the corporate food production and distribution system and create <u>food sovereignty</u>, it becomes transformational.

Public banking, <u>community land trusts</u>, worker <u>cooperatives</u>, <u>participatory budgeting</u>, and <u>universal basic income</u> are some specific economic policies that we think of as having the potential to be non-reformist reforms, as each operates through a non-capitalist logic: centering democratic ownership and/or control and operating for public benefit rather than private gain. At the same time, all these examples can happily coexist and unwittingly even strengthen capitalism, unless they are embedded in a transformative program.

What made [the Black Panthers' free breakfast program] a non-reformist reform was that it was part of a deeper, more radical vision.

Connecting Non-Reformist Reforms to Electoral Politics

How do you realize non-reformist reforms politically? One step that USSEN has taken toward this goal is to create a <u>"candidate questionnaire."</u> The questionnaire is designed to be a practical tool to move beyond individual policies and toward a broader challenge to the current capitalist political economy.

In essence, a candidate questionnaire is meant to be used for educational purposes, not to electioneer for or against a particular candidate. It compares what different candidates running for a particular office think about important issues that might help to advance the idea of a solidarity economy.

Note that 501c3 nonprofit organizations are not allowed to make guides that tell people who to vote for. However, they *can* share guides to help educate people on the candidates without picking sides. The IRS has promulgated rules for candidate questionnaires to make sure they're fair and unbiased. They look at things like if the questions are clear and if all candidates get the same questions and have enough time to answer. They also want to see that the candidates' answers aren't changed. Whether using our questionnaire or making your own, nonprofits must be careful to ask neutral questions, not ones that show what answer they think is right.

An Invitation

As mentioned above, the two of us met at the first US Social Forum. Both of us at the time sought to develop workshops and panels (Kawano around the solidarity economy and Cobb around democratic practice).

Our thinking has evolved. For instance, one of us (Cobb) initially only saw the solidarity economy as being about cooperatives, not a strategic plan to democratize the political economy. It took time to realize that the solidarity economy framework provides an opportunity to do more than create cooperatives. In fact, it offers an opportunity to engage collectively in a peaceful revolution by employing non-reformist reforms. We hope this article is an invitation for others to explore how to apply this strategic orientation in your own community.

One final note: The word "conspire" comes from the Latin words *con*, which means "together," and *spirare*, which means "to breathe." In its original construction, conspire literally means "to breathe together." In that spirit, we encourage readers to conspire with us.

And also, in regions such as Sudan, Gaza, and Ukraine, civilians, principally women and children, are the most killed. injured and displaced. Joumana, you have been horrified by what has been happening in Gaza, and you have family and community in Lebanon affected by escalating violence between Israel, Hamas, Hezbollah, Iran, and the USA. Would you like to comment on any of these things?

WOMEN WHO FUTURE

Recently, my eyes caught a phrase that grabbed hold of my attention; Women who futures. However, I misread it as Women who future. Having never known such a phrase, and the fact that it did not make sense to me, I started to look deeper into its meaning. When I refocused on the original phrase, I saw that "futures" was referring to the financial world in the context of that statement, yet I had already started my google searches to find nothing. My immediate guess was it meant a woman who is evolutionary in her thinking and her work in the world. Having spent the past two decades paying attention to women's leadership, and the past year researching what is next for the role of women in the midst of this evolutionary impulse, this happy accident woke me up.

I am not alone in the theory that these times call for us to get wildly creative to find new solutions to old problems and co-create a new narrative in order to create a new reality for humanity. Still, in my research, I was bumping up against something I could not reckon with or articulate, and knew something wanted to come through; something new. This new clunky phrase led me to my answer. To that end, I have discovered something whose time has come to enter into the emerging new narrative.

Women Who Future is a woman who stretches the edges of the meaning of leadership beyond recognition to the degree that requires a new identity, and therefore a new title. It's existence in our narrative invites a new paradigm and also applies to every woman, regardless of her role in an organization, business, her family, or relationships. We are all being called upon now to drop the confines of the old structures and reimaging how we move forward together, utilizing the very gifts our bodies and minds are entrusted with. Like too many words and expressions in our current language that deserves another look, the understanding of *leadership* is constricted to the conventional meaning that is assumptive and one must qualify the type of leadership characteristics present, i.e.; Stewart Leadership, Transformational Leadership, Tribal Leadership, Feminine Leadership, etc. The word leadership alone implies a hierarchal structure and one that comes with authority, even when qualified otherwise.

Women who future share these methodologies, yet bring to the world a subtle and profound shift in energy, style, and shape. The results are time tested and proven, dating back thousands of years, with glimpses breaking through today in different hues.

There are nuances and styles that are unfamiliar because they are brand-new. They could not have existed before because we were not ready for them until now. The timeless qualities that have never wavered in our natural world and that we embody, remain intact. They never left us, but largely went underground until we were ready to harness their true power. The conditions are now perfect, which is why I propose, and liberally use this expression until it becomes as natural to the tongue as divine feminine.

Women who future respond to the familiar evolutionary impulse and draw on the same wellspring of wisdom as our ancestor grandmothers since the beginning of time. Their seed is passed from generation to generation, carrying within it an intelligence of universal womb-wisdom. Characteristics of compassion, nurturing, healing, creativity, collaboration, and intuition are stranded through every seed's DNA. It shares a frequency with the cosmos and a heartbeat with planet Earth. That seed of divinity is tucked in the womb of every woman who futures. We accept our sacred task to midwife the future into being. We know our past and accept that our future requires our full integrity with reverence. We root back to the nature of who we are and honor our relationship and relevance to the world. Within the ecosystem that thrives on all the organic, smaller touchpoints that are of the seed, is the divine feminine, ancient and new at the same time. It is our responsibility and our privilege.

While our methods can be firm and determined, they are without rank and vigor because we know that violences is not the balance of justice. The old, tired structures of hierarchy and power-over are replaced with actualized hierarchy and power-to. As is the example of feminine leadership, rather than the social stratification of power structures with choices made for the rest of us at the bottom by the few at the top, problems are solved in consultation and by consensus when possible. We operate in a manner of co-creation, in a circular manner, losing the vertical ladder, and looking across to listen to one another, never look down upon anyone.

We understand the system of a domination paradigm and have researched its history with fine brush strokes. We learn through well-researched and challenged data the cause and effect of recorded history and every law, rule, and the language that has served to keep us small, scared, and under control. We have also made great strides and overcome towering obstacles. However, the fact that in 2024 women's rights have been rolled back 50 years is one glaring sign that we are missing something important and have yet to pull up the root ball of patriarchy, even with such accomplishments to our credit.

Women who future today understand we have been working on addressing issues within the complex systems that were not designed for us in the first place. It is therefore natural that our limits of change are bound to the blueprint of those structures. It's time to circumvent the old system's scaffolding and get wildly creative. Women who future reimagine, question assumptions, and change the story for themselves, and therefore the world. We have been waiting for this permission, aching to see the removal of the ceiling keeping us contained, or else we threaten to break through it, shattering it with indignation. But indignation and destructive force is the old model. Solving a problem within the same construct that created it is not sustainable and known to be insanity. It is time to realize we are the ones of authority to call up the wellspring of the wisdom that we did not trust or believe we could access, and yearned for it at a deep level. Our solution is one rooted in grace for ourselves and the world. Its impact, like mycelium, spreads in every direction, supporting all the living world because we are, by nature intra-connected as an ecosystem.

When we accept that authority's root is authenticity, we more readily question assumptions and we notice the language that has been normalized and change it appropriately. We add new words and expressions where necessary, like I did with this new phrase. We start clearing the wounds of victimhood and trauma by doing our own internal work. We recognize when it's time for important and healthy endings, and because we have done our work and bring all of our beautiful parts, scars and all, we actualize a world that works for all. Through authenticity, we are the author of our next human story.

A Message from the Thirteen Indigenous Grandmothers

"As you move through these changing times... be easy on yourself and be easy on one another. You are at the beginning of something new. You are learning a new way of being. You will find that you are working less in the yang modes that you are used to.

You will stop working so hard at getting from point A to point B the way you have in the past, but instead, will spend more time experiencing yourself in the whole, and your place in it.

Instead of traveling to a goal out there, you will voyage deeper into yourself. Your mother's grandmother knew how to do this. Your ancestors from long ago knew how to do this. They knew the power of the feminine principle... and because you carry their DNA in your body, this wisdom and this way of being are within you.

Call on it. Call it up. Invite your ancestors in. As the yang-based habits and the decaying institutions on our planet begin to crumble, look up. A breeze is stirring. Feel the sun on your wings."

DEMOCRACY IS NOT A SPECTATOR SPORT

Every four years in the United States we have an election to determine the type of leadership and the direction in which we as a nation are moving. We like to think that this experiment we call democracy is strong, secure, and locked in stone. We hope and claim that our democracy is a beacon of light for the rest of the world. That every person eligible to vote has the opportunity to do so regardless of their views, the color of their skin, their nationality, or their sex. We claim to believe that we should make the voting process as easy as possible for eligible voters. That we should not place burdensome restrictions on certain classes of eligible voters because we are afraid of whom they will vote for. Elections are consequential on so many levels, and ideally, every voter wants to make the right decision and align their vote with their values and hopes for the country's future.

Even in the United States, this so-called beacon of light, our democracy has had to go through significant changes. In 1790 we passed our first law defining citizenship, the Naturalization Act of 1790. This law stated that only free white men of "good character," who had been living in the United States for two years or longer, could apply for citizenship. Others such as nonwhite residents, black and brown skinned people, indigenous people, women, and Asian people, were denied basic constitutional protections including the right to vote, own property, or testify in court. One would think that our leaders would embrace this transformational experiment in democracy by making voting easy and all inclusive. Instead, early on in the experiment, they took the opposite approach. In 1821, the state of New York passed a law which removed property requirements for white male voters, but required that "persons of color" own \$250 worth of property, "over and above all debts." In 1870 the Fifteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution was approved. It prevented states from denying the right to vote on grounds of "race, color, or previous condition of servitude." This led to a backlash with many states passing "Jim Crow" regulations. These included


poll taxes, literacy tests and grandfather clauses which intended to disenfranchise poor white and black voters. It was not until 1920 that women got the right to vote and then only white women. In 1965 the historic Voting Rights Act was passed which corrected many discriminatory election systems and districts.

We claim that we are in favor of a thriving democracy. We talk about the importance of voting and protecting people's right to vote. Yet in many states, legislators are pushing bills that would restrict people's right to vote. They are enacting legislation that makes it harder to vote. For a democracy to continue there must be a peaceful transfer of power when the election is over and the votes counted. Until recently, we failed to understand how dangerously fragile a democracy really is. Our democracy is teetering on the edge and inaction will help push it over. We would do well to also remember the words and actions of faith leaders like the departed champion of justice, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, who said, "If you are neutral in situations of injustice you have chosen the side of the oppressor." Because at this perilous juncture in our democracy, we all need to hear that silence means we would rather be complicit in stripping neighbors of their dignity and right to flourish in our country.

For a democracy to succeed our elections should be based on ideas about how we can move forward to create a better society for everyone. We hope that our decision on who to vote for is centered around the common good, not just our own individual wants. In his Encyclical, Fratelli Tutti, Pope Francis issued a call to action when he wrote: "we can seek a better kind of politics, one truly at the service of the common good." We expect that our candidates will present their ideas for moving forward in a truthful manner. That there will be respectful debates on these ideas. So, we as voters can make an informed decision on the direction we want our country to take. A decision based on verifiable information, not lies, innuendos and demonizing the other. A decision based on who will be the best leader, not the biggest bully. In

recent years we have witnessed a new phase of campaigning, where no low is too low, and the truth is in short supply.

In the US and across the globe we have seen the rise of the far-right Christian Nationalism. They oppose democracy and are attempting to create theocracies. They are attempting to establish governments whose purpose is not the common good but far-right Christian ideology. In Washington, DC on January 6th, 2021, violent armed insurrectionists simultaneously carrying bibles and images of Jesus attacked the Capitol Building and threatened to kill elected leaders of both parties. For perhaps the first time "losing our democracy" is high on the national priority list of voting issues. Pope Francis recently while speaking at the Italian Catholic Social Week in Italy said: "Catholics are called to be active participants in political life and be a force against the decline of democracy worldwide, "In today's world, democracy -- let's be honest -- is not in good health," Democracy is not a spectator sport. It requires all of us to be active participants.

Ukraine-Russian Tensions Increase Mediation Efforts Needed Urgently

The possible deployment of long-range, high precision missiles in Ukraine able to strike deeply into Russian territory and the predictable Russian repost has increased tensions in the armed conflict. Mediation efforts are needed. Are they possible in practice?

Mediation is action taken by a third party to facilitate hostile parties coming together to negotiate. The introduction of a third party distingishes mediation from direct negotiations between the parties. The Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) should have been the normal regional mediator in the Russia-Ukraine armed conflict, but its role has been greatly weakend, and the climate of cooperation destroyed.

The same may hold true for the United Nations. There have been a good number of discussions and some resolutions in the General Assembly but no formal mediation. We will have to see what may arise later in September when a large number of heads of government come to the U.N. for the Summit of the Future. There may be possibilities to get the two sides together informally to see if any common ground could be discerned between them.

The congregation in New York of permanent representatives to the U.N. from member countries has created a "standing diplomatic conference." Thus mediation is a continuous process within the U.N. system even when a mediator as such has not been named by the Secretary-General as had been named Ralph Bunche for the Middle East at an earlier stage in U.N. history.

Formal mediation is a complex process involving questions of the authority of the mediator and the skills and character of the individual mediator. Mediation requires both an institutional framework and the choice of an appropriate individual.

It is unlikely that formal mediation of the Russia-Ukraine conflict will be created now in New York, but we can hope that informal discussions take place setting out tension-reduction possibilities.

Hey, THEY!, we cut ourselves, it bleeds, We all have the same needs, whatever race or creed: Oh, open up your eyes, see Planetary ties.---Negotiate, forget the hate, get it done-donedone, get it done-done-done! Negotiate, don't fight it out, Or we're all gonna lose as our time runs out. The whole damn Planet will go up in smoke, We won't have nothin' as we drop and choke! You'll have no religion if that's your decision, Just burnt-up bodies in the cataclysm!"

Later on in the lyric, the tone moves to positive approaches we need to take to avoid such grief. In my animated poem, "The Cellphone Poem: You Think YOU'RE In Charge?!," the phone speaks haughtily and in a bullying manner to the listener, stating blatantly that he, the phone, rules their lives.

Rabbi Michael Lerner:

"Rick, I am impressed by all the good work you are doing with We, The World. Can I take some credit for getting you started on this path?"

Rick Ulfik: "Absolutely – without a doubt!"

(Note: As I am writing this, Hamas has launched a major attack on Israel and Israel has responded with a major counter attack. All the time I've known Rabbi Lerner he has worked on solutions to the Israeli-Palestinian crisis.)

I first heard about Rabbi Michael Lerner late in 1994 when I saw a small event notice in the New York Times. I was struck that the title of his event was actually longer than the event description. The event was titled: "No Mr. Gingrich You Don't Have A Mandate To Undermine Social Justice In The USA!"

At the event (which featured Gloria Steinem) I was impressed by Michael's 45 minute long Keynote Address, which I later got the recording of. I went up to him and said "Here I am. What do you want me to do?" He invited me to attend his weekly Salons on the Upper West Side in Manhattan.

I noticed that the literature Michael would hand out to volunteers and the public had voluminous amounts of wording. I remembered the recording I had of Michael's Keynote Address he gave at the event I met him at. I listened to his speech and proceeded to create bullet points of his main points. I created a One Page Presentation that turned out to be very useful to him and the others he was working with. Being a composer and studio musician at the time, it was very exciting (and different) for me to work directly on social issues. I became one of Michael Lerner's main conference organizers, along with Mark LeVine, under Michael's organization the Foundation For Ethics and Meaning (FEM).

Mark LeVine and I, along with Nanette Schorr and other FEM activists went on to organize a major national conference in 1996 for Michael Lerner (in collaboration with Peter Gabel and Tikkun Magazine staff).

In 1998 Michael and Peter left the FEM Board when Michael had a life threatening health crisis. Though he fully recovered, he realized he had to cut back on his activities. So Michael invited me, Mark LeVine, Nanette Schorr, Bruce Novak and other FEM activists to constitute the new FEM Board.

In 2000, in collaboration with Ralph White and the New York Open Center, the Foundation For Ethics and Meaning Board (along with Ruth Garbus, Rosa Naparstek and Jesse Rabinowitz) and a new organization that I founded (We, The World), convened "Re-Imagining Politics and Society at the Millennium". It was a massive global conference with 252 world class Speakers including Riane Eisler, Naomi Klein, Cornel West, Peter Gabel, Marianne Williamson, Jonathan Granoff and, of course, Rabbi Michael Lerner.

Rabbi Lerner went on to create the Network of Spiritual Progressives (NSP). Meanwhile, I became hooked on activism and I went on to expand the activities of We, The World and the WE Campaign at <u>WE.net</u>. We, The World is an international coalition-building organization to unite and amplify the efforts of changemakers working for the Common Good. We now have branches in Botswana, Tanzania, Burundi, Uganda and Rwanda.

Our 11 Days of Global Unity/11 Campaigns for Change has become an inspiring international movement for peace, justice, sustainability and transformation with participants and supporters that have included: Desmond Tutu, Jane Goodall, Deepak Chopra, Marianne Williamson, Ralph Nader, Bill McKibben, Eve Ensler, Arun Gandhi, Riane Eisler, Jonathan Granoff, Hazel Henderson, Peter Gabel, Rabbi Michael Lerner and many others.

So, yes, my life changed forever – due, in large part, because of meeting you Rabbi Michael Lerner! I am deeply grateful to you for directly involving me in your work, and inspiring me to take the path I am now on. Much love to you.

FLAGS OF ONE FAMILY: THE ART OF SHARED HUMANITY

When I stepped into Linda DeHart's studio, I was in awe. It was a marvelous sight. The light streamed through every window, casting a golden hue onto a river of bright colors covering every orifice. I have never stepped into a room with more rhythm, more spirit, more personality. Linda's art seemed to dance along every wall in an harmonious way, colors traveling in a stream from paintings to sculptures to quilts. In the center of it all stood a vase brimming with dozens of flags. Even without context, I could tell that these flags had a story extending beyond their physical matter. Acrylic poles holstered shimmering rainbows of fabric triangles, vessels for something deeper, something timeless.

After a few hellos, Linda sat with us and began to share her journey. In 1984, she embarked on creating her flags, calling them both 'Wings of the Heart' and 'Flags of One Family.' These flags have become iconic landmarks, evolving into beacons of unity that symbolize both our shared humanity and our unique individuality.

Linda showed my mother and me photographs of the first time her flags were carried up Mohonk Mountain in Upstate New York, as part of a protest for peace aimed at encouraging reflection. Linda's ideas traveled far and wide, being featured at the Earth Summit in Rio, gracing the halls of the Nicholas Roerich Museum in Moscow, celebrated atevents with The World Peace Prayer Society in New York, and showcased at numerous other locations around the world, including recent displays in Hiroshima, Japan, and at Times Square in New York City.

Even the Dalai Lama complimented the flags, a testament to the power of their message. No matter the location, these flags unite people as one family on earth, bound by our shared humanity and diversity.

The true beauty of Wings of the Heart is the innate quality to give each viewer the ability to find their own meanings while looking at the same object. Linda mastered the art of creating unity and peace while still celebrating the diversity of each individual that makes life so special. She invited us to partake in her art, contribute to her cause, and learn her craft, and that's when the experience became something profoundly personal. We were presented with a dozen clear plastic poles of varying diameters. Linda explained how the different thickness of the flags would create distinct movements in the wind, as each thickness provides a different level of flexibility. When each person waves the flags, their unique motions can be conveyed to the universe.

We set to work, using hand saws to cut each pole to whatever height we desired. Linda encouraged us to make each flag a little different and embrace that despite distinctions, every flag would still be part of a collective whole. Once all the flag poles were cut to size, we carefully handpicked which flags we felt belonged on each pole, accounting for size, color and whatever simply felt right. We lined the edge of every flag with hot glue and rolled it around the flagpole until the entire piece was secure. There was something meditative in the act of lining the edges with glue and securing the flags to their poles, knowing that we were contributing to an artwork that spoke of peace, unity, and hope.

There is no one I love more in this world than my mother. I can confidently say she is the bravest, strongest, and most intelligent woman I know. Every moment I spend with her is special and brings me joy. Linda encouraged us to appreciate the moment to ground ourselves in our experiences, and to recognize the significance of what we were creating - not just flags, but memories that would endure.

For hours, we created together in a peaceful rhythm, unplugged from the digital world and appreciating the simplicity of our shared time. There's nothing quite like the bond between a mother and her daughter, and this allowed every minute we spent sawing, measuring, and gluing to become a treasured memory. I had the privilege of witnessing two remarkable women pour their heart into this project, and I felt so incredibly fortunate to be part of this experience.

As we crafted the art, there was an indescribable peace, a solace in knowing we were building tangible manifestations of peace that would long outlive us. Linda shared quips about how she does not have a cell phone, and can only be reached via her landline when she's at home - a notion I, as a Gen Z child, found unimaginable, yet my mother found delightful. Meanwhile, Arthur, her husband, an incredibly sharp 92-year-old, regaled us with tales of the twelve languages he spoke, including ancient Greek, of course. I saw my mother truly in her element, passionately discussing how art endures through the passage of time, weaving our experiences into a tapestry of creativity, connection, and love. Linda's passion for peace and unity is palpable. It feels as though she had been placed on this earth to solely spread a message of peace and harmony through her art, and Wings of the Heart embodies this mission beautifully. She has created hundreds of flags, with thousands of meanings, yet, the core message remains the same: a celebration of unity and a tribute to the beauty of our diversity.

Participating in Linda's art opened my eyes to a world of possibility that I hadn't given thought to prior. She guided me to appreciate the nuances in day-to-day life and taught me to seek meaning in even the smallest detail, whether it's a flag or a shared moment.

So, the next time you encounter something seemingly ordinary, I implore you to pause and ponder for a bit. What does it mean to you? How can you uncover deeper significance? Let your mind wander and explore, you'll be surprised where it can take you.
